Dear Airdrie RVS Parents and Guardians,

The Board of Trustees of Rocky View Schools' (RVS) is considering possible solutions to help address overutilized schools in Airdrie. Each solution could have a range of impacts including boundary changes/new designated schools/changes to grade levels served in schools. The <u>Balancing Airdrie Student Spaces</u> engagement is ongoing through March 2024 with in-person open houses on **January 23**, **30**, **31 and February 6** and a new online survey open January 23 to March 17.

We encourage you to visit an open house most convenient for you and share your thoughts in-person and through RVSEngage starting January 23. Each of these open houses will have the same information so you can visit the one that is convenient for you.

Jan. 23, 6:30 - 8 p.m.: George McDougall High School

Jan. 30, 6:30 - 8 p.m.: C.W. Perry School

Jan. 31, 6:30 – 8 p.m.: W.H. Croxford High School

Feb. 6, 6:30 – 8 p.m.: Bert Church High School

Comprehensive information on the possible solutions being considered will be available at the open houses, as well as a chance to connect with RVS Trustees and administrators. The open houses are a drop-in format in order to be flexible for attendees.

Detailed information about the potential solutions being considered and how to provide feedback is also available on <a href="RVSEngage">RVSEngage</a>. The Board highly values input and feedback from Airdrie families and community members to help inform this important decision.

The Board aims to reach a decision at the April 25, 2024, public meeting, which will take effect at the start of the 2025/26 school year. Given the current overutilization of some schools, it is possible changes for specific schools may need to happen as early as September 2024. We understand the importance of these decisions to Airdrie families, and we thank you for your contributions in this process. We look forward to hearing from you.

You can go in to RVSEngage to share your thoughts if there are any additional ideas for the decisions being made

  - Meghan will need one month's notice to attain volunteers for planned events, if possible. There will be an ongoing volunteer sign up sheet online in which I would like to add all known events for this year so far including how many volunteers are needed and what they would be doing. Google form will be sent out at the end of the week to parents.

   April 12/13th tentative dates for a market. Insurance needs to get organized before anything else. As a society you need to get insurance.

one (5-8) if there is not enough attendance we can combine into one dance. Draws and baskets for students. Also talks about a raffle.

Budget \$1100.00 including supplies. Talks of a concession.
